Daisy Ng has served as Chief Human Resources Officer for Darden Restaurants since June 2009. A member of Darden's Executive Team, she leads the development of Darden's people strategy as well as building organizational capability and employee culture to further enable Darden's growth. She is also responsible for all aspects of the HR functions within Darden, including the oversight of the HR organizations within each of Darden's operating companies.



Darden is the world's largest full-service restaurant operating company with annual sales of \$7.5 billion. The company owns and operates 1,900 Red Lobster, Olive Garden, LongHorn Steakhouse, The Capital Grille, Bahama Breeze and Seasons 52 restaurants in North America, employs approximately 180,000 people and serves more than 400 million meals annually. In 2011, Darden became the first full-service restaurant company ever to be named to the FORTUNE "100 Best Companies to Work For" list.

Daisy joined Darden in October 2005 as Senior Vice President of Talent Management and led a multi-year strategy to design systems and tools that better enabled Darden to identify and develop outstanding leaders and drove stronger employee engagement. Prior to joining Darden, she was Chief Learning Officer and Vice President, Workforce Development for Hewlett-Packard.

Daisy has more than 25 years of experience in human resources, holding various senior executive positions in a number of international companies in Asia Pacific, Canada and the United States. Her experience has included roles across a variety of HR functions: strategic planning, organization design and effectiveness, training and development, talent management, international and domestic relocations, staffing and planning, compensation and benefits, HR information system and operations.
